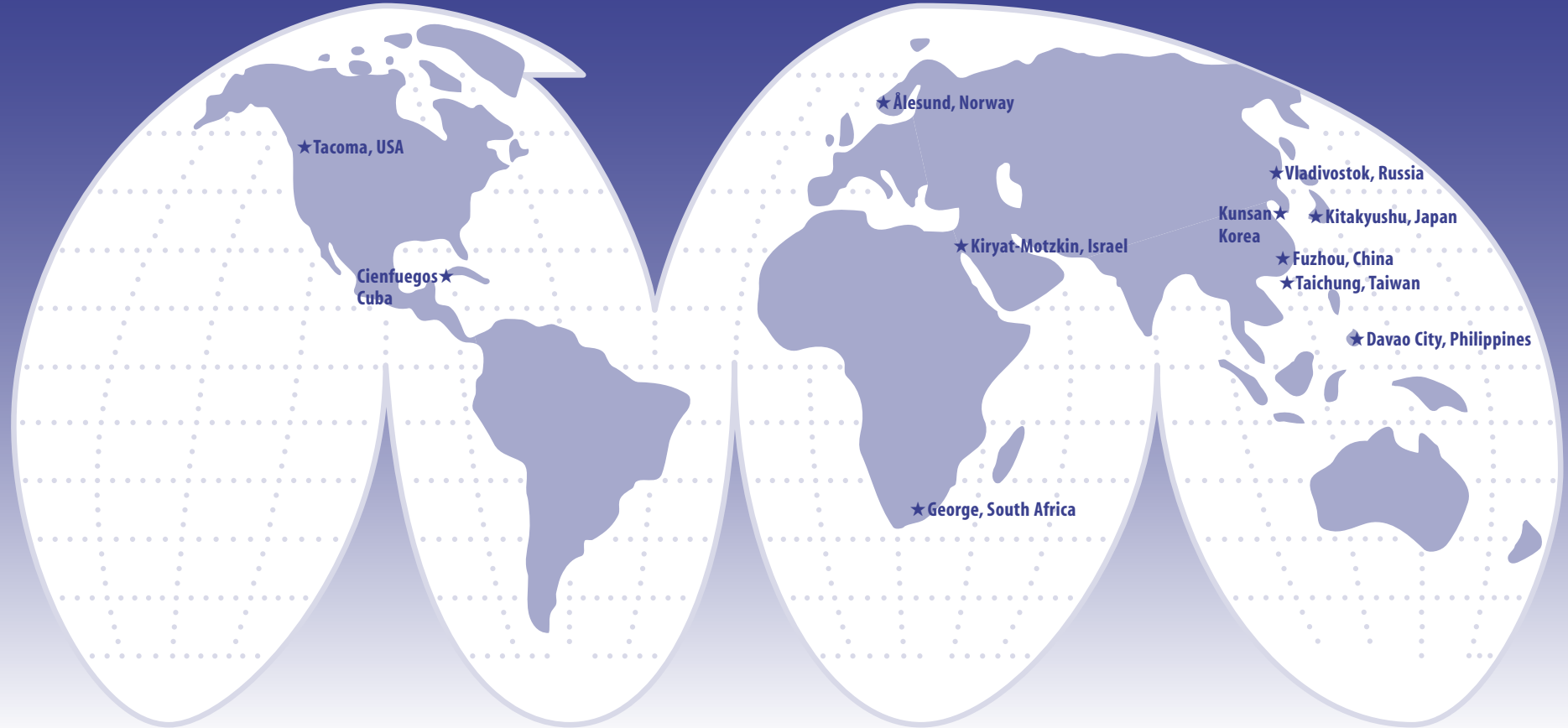

Sister Cities Objectives

Through active participation and financial support, private citizens and local government work together to promote international understanding and goodwill. Cultural sharing in the forms of international visitation and hospitality leads to long lasting relationships and a deeper mutual understanding.

Sister City links have become an increasingly important conduit for development of economic trade and tourism. Mutual understanding and diplomatic dialogue develop through exchanges and activities in such areas as educa-

tion, language, art, song and dance, cuisine, social issues, youth, sports, trade, health and medicine, science and technology, wildlife, environment, and government.

About Sister Cities International

Sister Cities International was created in 1956 by Dwight D. Eisenhower as a people-to-people exchange between Americans and citizens of other countries.

- It is dedicated to promoting global understanding by encouraging and assisting sister city relationships between U.S. communities and their citizens, and cities throughout the world.

- It provides planned and continuous contact between citizens of all ages, on a variety of levels to motivate friendship and respect for diversity.
- It is a private, non-profit national membership organization for more than 1,600 U.S. cities and their local volunteer committees.

The program is supported by the U.S. Information Agency and by a number of private foundations and contributors. The goals and objectives of the organization are carried out by citizen volunteers in cooperation with their local governments.
